Packed Lunch Space

Our Education Centre is a bright and airy room that can be used for activities, eating packed lunches, and for storing bags and coats. The room is lockable if required and has access to toilets nearby.

The room can hold a group of up to 25 comfortably and up to 33 at a squeeze. Our courtyard can also be used as a lunch space if the weather permits!

Disabled Access

The museum has full disabled access, apart from our Victorian Fisherman's cottage, which can be viewed from the Days of Steam gallery instead.

Parking

There is a car park across from the museum which has bays for coaches to be parked. Charges apply during the summer months.

- The maximum class size for a visit to the museum is 33 students. If you wish to bring more than one class/group please contact the museum.
- Particular areas of the museum can be cold in winter, especially in the boatyard where there is no heating to preserve the boats. Please dress appropriately!
- Behaviour and conduct of classes and groups are the responsibility of teachers and accompanying adults at all times during the visit.
