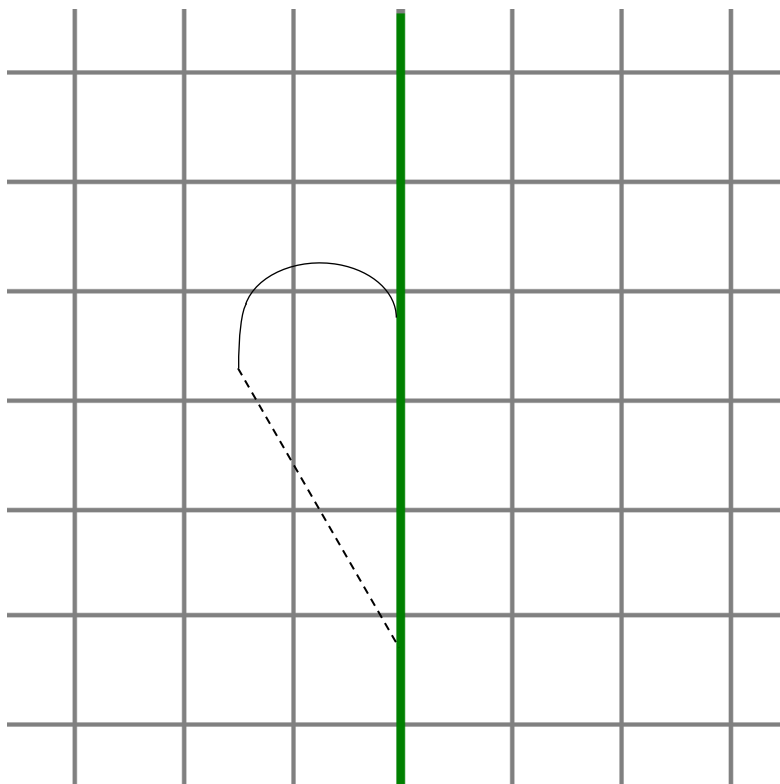
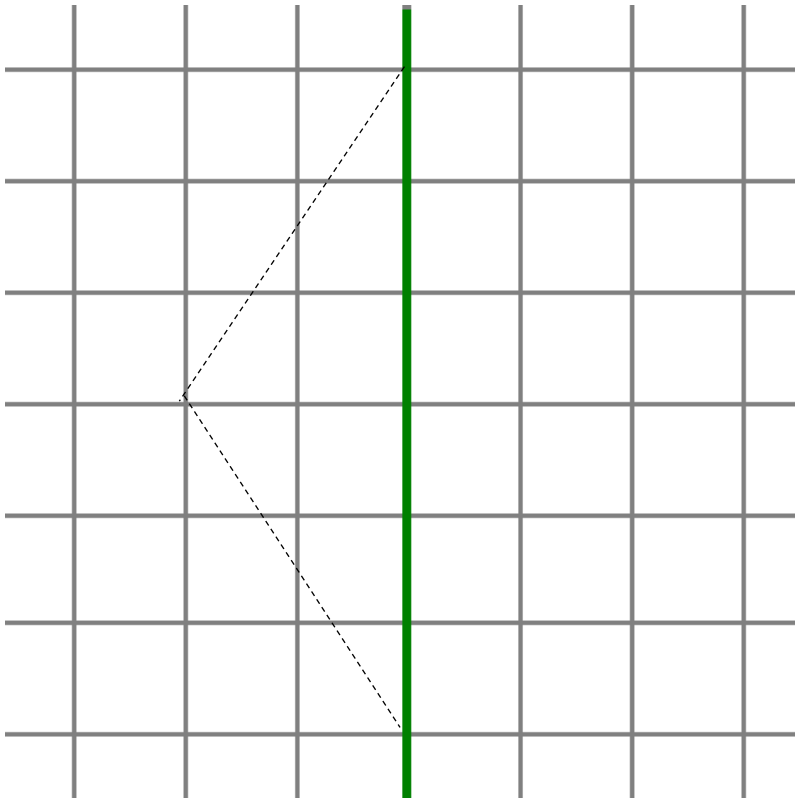
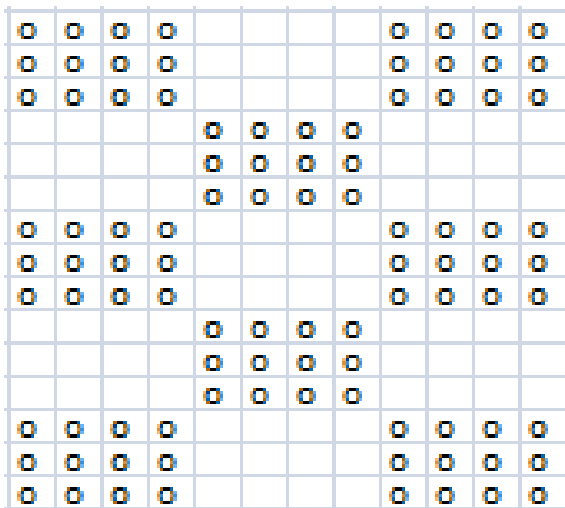
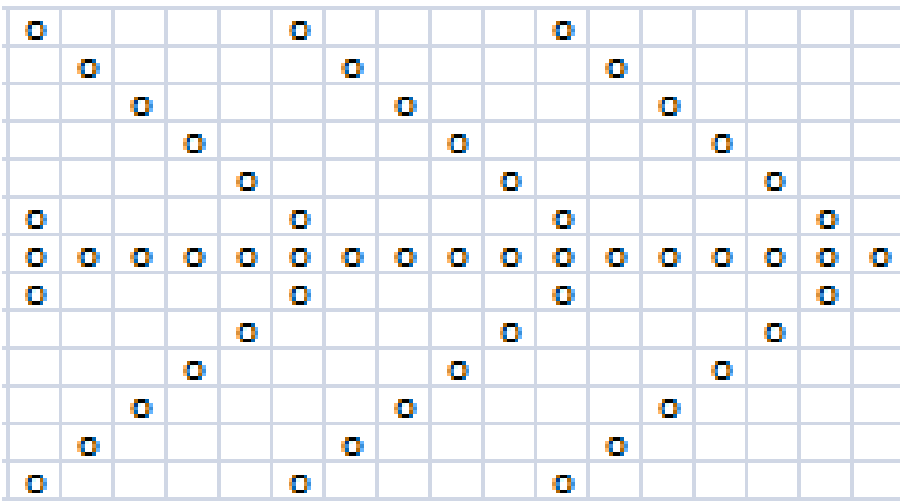




























Fishermen used to wear jumpers called ganseys. Ganseys are knitted with different repeating patterns.
